ORCHIDEES BLANCHES – INSTALLATION OF SOLAR PANELS – SEPTEMBER 2025

The Medical Educational Center “Les Orchidées Blanches” in Antananarivo welcomes about a hundred people with intellectual disabilities and offers them adapted vocational training, craft workshops, as well as social integration programs. Our Endowment Fund finances the installation of solar panels.

VIVRE AUX ECLATS – CLOWN INTERVENTIONS – SEPTEMBER 2025

The clowns from “Vivre aux Eclats” (www.vivreaxeclats.fr) intervene at the CEM of Dommartin (69) as mediators of emotion and discovery. They allow children and adolescents to express themselves, experience unique sensory experiences, and strengthen their social ties with their peers, family, and caregivers. Our Foundation finances part of the clowns' interventions.

LE DOMAINE DE L'AUBE – PALLIATIVE CARE HOME IN ROANNE – SEPTEMBER 2025

Le Domaine de l'Aube is carrying out the project to create a 24-bed palliative care home in Roanne as well as the construction of a family house composed of accommodation studios. Its opening is scheduled for 2028. Our Corporate Foundation is committed to financing the equipped kitchen and dining area.

EKLYA – PURCHASE OF SPECIFIC FURNITURE FOR INCLUSIVE CLASSROOM – JUNE 2025

EKLYA School of Business, a business school within the CCI Lyon Métropole network, is implementing a degree program in the fields of commerce and distribution for about twenty young people with disabilities (mostly ASD and Down syndrome).

Clubhouses are places of life and exchange created for and with people living with mental disorder with the mission of facilitating their social and professional reintegration.

These reception centers are co-managed by the beneficiaries – the members – with the help of an employed team; they meet freely and participate in the various integration and management activities of the place.

The biographers that our Corporate Foundation supports will intervene in the Center Léon Berard in Lyon.

ADS MADAGASCAR - SUPPORT FOR THE AMBATOLAMPY DEVICE CENTER FOR THE DISABLED – JUNE 2024

ADS aims to provide aid to deprived populations in the areas of health and education, in particular by providing them with second-life equipment. The Dominique & Tom Alberici Foundation provides support to renew and complete the tools and machines that have become obsolete at the Ambotolampy Apparatus Center for the disabled.

ADH – RAID BETWEEN TWO SEAS – JUNE 2024

ADH supports the social reintegration of injured soldiers, firefighters, gendarmes and police officers, through outdoor practices and therapeutic activities, applied to physically and/or psychologically injured people. Our Foundation participated in the acquisition of a Trialp which will be used by an injured person with reduced mobility doing a traveling raid between 2 seas with a group (from Agde to Royan), which will take place in September 2024 (600 km, 7 stages). <https://assoadh.org/>

LA CAPE - ASSISTANCE DOGS SURRENDER COURSE – JUNE 2024

La Cape is an association whose mission is to raise, train and hand over free of charge assistance dogs specifically trained to accompany people suffering from post-traumatic stress (victims of attacks, soldiers and first responders, firefighters, police officers and caregivers). The dog is trained for 18 to 24 months to allow the beneficiary with whom he will be in a duo a return to social and professional life. At the end of the training, La Cape organizes a free 10-day course during which the beneficiary will discover their new companion, surrounded by psychologists, dog trainers and the families who welcomed the dog during its training. The Dominique & Tom Alberici Foundation is pleased to have contributed to the financing of an internship at Château-Mirabel in Puylaurens, in Tarn, during which 5 dogs were given to 5 beneficiaries.

CUIVRES EN DOMBES - LE LAC DE CHANAL, HYPNOTINES VOL 2 – FEBRUARY 2024

Cuivres en Dombes aims to promote the cultural and artistic development of the Dombes sector (Ain) and its surroundings through two main axes: the Festival combining music and heritage; the Seasons bring a local culture to the attention of people with disabilities. The PEP18, "Pupilles de l'Enseignement Publique du Cher", is part of a network of 123 associations, created in 1917. Their objective is a public service mission by providing responses in the field of education and leisure adapted to the needs of children and adults weakened by life. Our Corporate Foundation supports in 2021 the project of photographs of the Canal du Berry, carried out with children from an IME and some socially vulnerable adults. We finance the book which will bring together the photos, the film of this report and the printing of pictures.

We are renewing our partnership in 2024 with the support of a new photographic project developed as part of the 2024 Cultural Olympics allowing adolescents from an IME and a ULIS class to take an interest in different sporting disciplines through a photographic journey. www.pep18.fr

ZIMZAM – ADAPTED CIRCUS ACTIVITIES IN THE VAUCLUSE – APRIL 2014 – FEBRUARY 2024

Created in 2005, ZimZam offers adapted circus workshops and supports the creation and distribution of shows put on by disabled and able-bodied artists. The project supported in 2014 by the foundation aims to install a permanent big top in the Vaucluse, to welcome persons cared for in facilities throughout the region. In 2024, ZimZam wanted to acquire a traveling big top to allow people who are unable to travel due to geographic, economic and logistical constraints, to be able to participate in the circus workshops offered by ZimZam. <http://www.zimzamacircus.org>

ZICOMATIC – FESTIVAL EN SCENE – COZI CAFE – MARCH 2022 – FEBRUARY 2024

Zicomatic is an association that fights against the isolation of people with disabilities by offering cultural and sports projects. It also contributes to public awareness of disability with a traveling photo exhibition and by intervening in schools and businesses. Our corporate foundation supports the association for the organization of its inclusive "En scène" festival.

PASSERELLE OUEST – SWIMMING MEETING – DECEMBER 2022 – FEVRIER 2024

This parents' association organizes swimming lessons for young people with intellectual disabilities at the swimming pool in Francheville (Rhône). The project that our Corporate Foundation supports is the

participation of around twenty members in the "Special Olympics France" which will take place in Valbonne in March 2023. In 2022, 4 swimmers were qualified for the final of the French sports championship adapted. Participation in such events develops self-esteem, autonomy and the courage essential to everyday life. We renewed our support to Passerelle Ouest in 2024.

ANIMAL'HOM – MARKET GARDENING WORKSHOPS – BEEKEEPING WORKSHOPS – FEBRUARY 2023 – FEBRUARY 2024

Animal'Hom is an Alsatian association created by caregivers, whose activities are focused on people with mental disabilities. It offers three programs: an animal mediation space, DIY assistance, relocation and home support, and finally a socio-professional reintegration program. It offers market gardening workshops that take place 3 to 4 times a week and are very followed by members. These workshops allow a resumption of activity and a re-socialization. Our Endowment Fund, supported by a directed donation from the biotechnology company AMOLYT Pharma, is contributing to this project. We renewed our support to Animal'hom in 2024 with the development of apiaries and a honey house.

AGEPA – LE PHARE – DECEMBER 2023

AGEPA is the manager of the Les Emeraudes retirement home in Vaugneray (Rhône). The association wishes to renovate a mansion located near Les Emeraudes, in order to create studios and common spaces intended to accommodate independent elderly families with adult children with disabilities and to support them in thinking about the future of their child in the event of loss of autonomy of one of the parents. The opening of the house is planned for 2024. Our Corporate Foundation is intervening here as part of our FAOMA call for projects, aiming to create living spaces for people suffering from disabilities or cancer.

DOMAINE DE L'AUBE – PALLIATIVE CARE HOME IN LOIRE – DECEMBER 2023

The Domaine de l'Aube aims to create the first palliative care home in the Loire in the Roanne region. This house will have a capacity of 24 beds and provides for the construction of a family house made up of accommodation studios. It will be an innovative place, supported by a multidisciplinary care team and listening and support volunteers. A therapeutic garden is also planned, reception and play areas for children as well as a library. Its opening is scheduled for 2025. Our Corporate Foundation intervenes here as part of our FAOMA call for projects, aiming to create living spaces for people suffering from disabilities or cancer.

SIEL BLEU – LA MAISON DE REGINE – DECEMBER 2023

SIEL Bleu aims to maintain and improve physical abilities, promote quality of life and health for people weakened by advancing age, chronic illness, mental, physical or social disability. The project presented here by SIEL Bleu is the renovation of the 'Maison de Régine' which will thus become a place of welcome, rejuvenation and rest for people in fragile situations, particularly those suffering from cancer. Its renovation will make it possible to organize 2 or 3 respite stays per year for 7 to 10 people. This farmhouse is in Teillay (Ille-et-Vilaine), on 17,000 m² of land with an orchard. Our Corporate Foundation intervenes here as part of our FAOMA call for projects, aiming to create living spaces for people suffering from disabilities or cancer.

AGIVR – RESPIT HOUSE – DECEMBER 2023

AGIVR is a parents' association created almost 70 years ago and located in Villefranche-sur-Saône (Rhône). It facilitates access to housing, work, healthcare, sports and leisure for people with mental and psychological disabilities, accompanies these people throughout life towards greater autonomy and provides support to caregivers. Our Corporate Foundation intervenes here as part of our FAOMA call for projects, aimed at creating living spaces for people suffering from disabilities or cancer. The AGIVR project is a respite home in Beaujolais, in Saint-Julien. This golden stone house in the heart of the village includes a main building and an annex in a 1,500 m² park. It will be intended to accommodate caregivers with around twenty beds. The opening is scheduled for the end of 2025. <https://agivr.asso.fr/>

CHEER UP FEDERATION! – REBONDS PROGRAM – JULY 2010 – DECEMBER 2023

In 2010, our Corporate Foundation helped the Cheer Up! to deploy its branches in Lyon and other French cities. In 2023, our Endowment Fund participates in financing the Rebonds program, set up in 2020, and which offers young adults in their post-treatment period a 3-month program during which they will be supported by volunteers and coaches in their personal and professional projects. <https://cheer-up.fr/>

QUELLE HISTOIRE! – ÇA CONTE A L'HOPITAL – VIDEO-STORYTELLING – JANUARY 2018 – JULY 2020 – DECEMBER 2021 – DECEMBRE 2023

The goal of the association "Quelle Histoire!" (What a story!) is to create, produce and broadcast living shows. It promotes the cultures of the world and is focusing on projects involving professional artists and people with physical, mental or social difficulties. The grant from our Foundation is for the "Ça conte à l'hôpital" (Tales at the hospital) project, in which professional storytellers use tales as an artistic and therapeutic tool for hospitalized people. In collaboration with the hospital professionals, the storytellers propose targeted actions to the patients, based on their pathology, their condition of hospitalization and by privileging the most isolated patients. In 2020 our Foundation participated in the video-storytelling project organized at the children's bedside. In 2022, thanks to a donation from SERB pharmaceutical company (<https://serb.eu/>), we support the project to set up the association in Lyonnaise hospitals, this aid is renewed in December 2023. www.quelle-histoire.Org

MAISON DE NICODEME – CREATION OF A PALLIATIVE CARE HOME – MARCH 2022 – DECEMBER 2023

La Maison de Nicodème is a palliative care home in Nantes, France. Innovative in its architectural design, it is meant to be welcoming with a comprehensive care of patients by a multidisciplinary team. Approved by the ARS and managed by the Hôpital Saint-Thomas de Villeneuve, this house has a capacity of 18 to 24 beds. The inauguration took place at the end of March 2022. Our company Foundation has contributed to the arrangement of the rooms.

In December 2023, our Foundation will once again support the Maison de Nicodème by participating in financing the employment of a volunteer coordinator. <https://www.maisondenicodeme.fr/>

MADATRISO – FINANCIAL AID – OCTOBER 2021 – MARCH 2022 – DECEMBER 2023

This parents' association located in Antananarivo has set itself the mission of caring for children with Down syndrome by offering them varied, therapeutic and fun activities with the help of psychologists and specialized educators. We started supporting MadatrISO in October 2021. In March 2022, our Endowment Fund strengthened its financial support to MadatrISO, to compensate for roof damage caused by cyclone Bastirai and for the purchase of food and medicine. In 2023, MadatrISO found premises in the city center to accommodate 20 children out of the 70 member families and offer them specific follow-up with health professionals. Our Endowment Fund contributes to the development of the premises.

RECRE@CTION – CIRCUS WORKSHOPS FOR CHILDREN – DECEMBER 2023

Récré@ction is an association created by a medical team from the child psychiatry department of the Hénin-Beaumont hospital center. Our Corporate Foundation helps financing circus workshops which take place throughout the year with the "Bruits de couloirs" association and which, thanks to adapted equipment, allows children to flourish by developing their imagination through motor and sensory experiments.

APPEL – FANARENANA ASSOCIATION IN MADAGASCAR – DECEMBER 2023

L'APPEL is a French association responding to local calls. The project supported by our Endowment Fund is focused on Fanarenana, a multidisciplinary establishment created 10 years ago to welcome children and adolescents with disabilities and offer them professional training. Several educators are present in the association as well as two teachers made available to them by the government. <https://www.lappel.org/>

MAISON LEON BERARD – ARRANGEMENT OF PARENTS'HOUSE – DECEMBER 2023

The Léon Bérard center is the Lyon cancer center. The parents'house Maison Léon Bérard was built in 1996 at the instigation of the Léon Bérard regional association for children with cancer, intended to accommodate the parents of children hospitalized at the CLB and in Lyon hospitals. It offers around twenty rooms and spaces common. Purchased by the Center in 2011, the house requires refreshing work. Our Dominique & Tom Alberici Foundation helps finance the renovation of common areas.

During the COVID-19 pandemic in the spring of 2020, these children who are usually cared for in hospital are locked at home. To allow continuity of care, Endowment Fund Institut Dominique & Tom Alberici has provided financial assistance to provide these children with a digital tablet.

ODYNÉO – HACKATHON – SEPTEMBRE 2019

Odyneo supports people with neuromotor disabilities and their families since 1959, with 31 institutions in the Rhône, Ain and Jura districts as of today. On the occasion of its 60th birthday, the association organizes a “hackathon” in November 2019, whose theme is the mobility of wheelchair users in a small space. SAUVEGARDE 69 – May 2019

Sauvegarde 69 is actively involved in the social and medico-social sectors.

The project is organised by the Emmanuel Gounot de Vénissieux home-based special needs education and care service (SESSAD, in the Lyon region), which cares for children and young teenagers with behavioural disorders. The aim is to help six children shoot six short videos with the help of SESSAD staff and a professional videographer.

Each video begins with children identifying a significant event in their lives, before choosing a work of art during a visit to the Fine Arts Museum in Lyon.

These short films are then put together and shown within the SESSAD, and in schools and culture centres throughout the district.

JHAM (JUMELAGE HANDICAP AIDE MADAGASCAR) – APRIL 2015 AND NOVEMBER 2016 – JULY 2018 TO MARCH 2019

Madagascar is among the 10 poorest countries in the world, and it lacks the facilities required to provide proper accommodation for the most vulnerable children, making the situation for disabled children all the more difficult.

The JHAM project consists of setting up a partnership over several years between the ARIMC (an association located in the Rhône-Alpes area for people with cerebral-motor disabilities) and six Madagascan centres for disabled persons. To ensure its smooth and efficient functioning and longevity, this partnership is organised and financed by Institut Dominique & Tom Alberici.

The first stage of the project, in 2015, consisted of collecting and shipping out equipment adapted for disabled children and young adults (wheelchairs, pushchairs, furniture, etc.), and getting to know what their requirements are in terms of training.

In 2017, after a week of observation in March, Institut Dominique & Tom Alberici will ship out equipment in June and organise a one-week collective education programme in two centres with French education specialists in October 2017.

The 3rd phase, JHAM3, launched in 2018 with a collection of items such as adaptive equipment, games, educational toys and books, stationery, school supplies, clothing and household linen.

The 33 m³ container left France on the 28th December en route for Toamasina in Madagascar, and we distributed the equipment to ten Malagasy organisations during our mission between the 3rd and 17th March. A collective education programme was organized in two centres with French education specialists in March 2018, and we also paid a visit to two other organisations whose equipment was funded by our Endowment Fund.

MIETE – FEST'DIF – FEBRUARY 2016 AND FEBRUARY 2019

For the second time, the Dominique & Tom Alberici Foundation is supporting La Miete by helping to organise its Fest'Dif festival in Villeurbanne (Rhône) on the 5th and 6th July 2019, which aims to promote difference and diversity.

This festival is an event devoted to expression and meetings that celebrate and promote all forms of difference through workshops, various types of shows, and interactive trails.

The programme includes meeting and talking to people, building relationships between participants, and discovering tools and avenues for reflection to help people who experience reduced mobility or isolation reintegrate in society or the professional world.

MAGIE A L'HOPITAL – TABLETS FOR THE CHILDREN OF HOSPITAL NECKER – OCTOBER 2018

The Magie à l'hôpital association organizes mainly magic shows for children hospitalized in 15 hospitals in France. The Dominique & Tom Alberici Foundation has supported this association by financing the training of volunteer magicians in 2013, and by creating and publishing a book from the "Magic in the Hospital" collection in 2015.

The Foundation Dominique & Tom Alberici participates during the year 2018 in the musical workshops of the association.

OASIS DES DOMES – REFRIGERANT HELMETS – JULY 2018

This association exists since 1991 in the city of Clermont-Ferrand and supports people affected by cancer, offering them care support. The project carried here by Oasis des Domes, and funded in part by the Dominique & Tom Alberici Foundation, is the acquisition of refrigerant helmets that limit hair loss ie alopecia entailed by chemotherapy.

CENTRE SEMBANA MIJORO – EQUIPMENT OF A NEW BUILDING – APRIL 2018

Sembana Mijoro is a malagasy center, located in Antananarivo, which works for the educational integration of children and young handicapped people. It is supported by JHAM and the Endowment Fund Dominique & Tom Alberici.

In order to ensure its financial autonomy, the Center has decided to invest in income generating activities by rehabilitating a building that will house various workshops. Our support focuses on financing the equipment of activities and outdoor spaces. <http://www.csm-mada.mg/>

HORIZON CANCER – BEAUTY CARE SUPPORT FOR CANCER PATIENTS – FEBRUARY 2013 AND APRIL 2018

Association Horizon Cancer located in Montfermeil (93) helps people affected by cancer and their families in the following areas: moral, administrative, financial and legal supports. The Foundation Dominique & Tom Alberici has already participated in the financing of beauty care with Horizon Cancer in February 2013.

PLEIN VENT SURDITÉ – CDI EQUIPMENT – APRIL 2018

The Plein Vent Surdit  Institute is an institution set up in 1815 in Saint-Etienne, which takes care of young deaf people aged between 10 and 20 years. The missions of this establishment are multiple: educational, follow-up services, social and paramedical. An interpreting service and trainings in French Sign Language are also offered. Plein Vent Surdit  solicited the support of the Foundation Dominique & Tom Alberici for its equipment in multimedia devices.

AEEDM – JANUARY 2018

Based in Antsirabe (Madagascar), AEEDM is an association of parents and educators/specialized teachers of mentally deficient children. The project of this association is to create a class for the children and young mentally handicapped persons of the region of Antsirabe, who are not in school. The Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici finances the Center's equipment with tables, chairs, shelves and games. Wooden material will be manufactured by the "Centre du Sacr -Coeur" from Ambatolampy, which trains young Malagasy from disadvantaged backgrounds.

LUC HANDIBASKET – JULY 2017

The Lille University Club (LUC), created in 2005, offers various physical activities to disabled and valid people. LUC Handibasket is a section of the LUC, whose teams are involved in competition tournaments, such as French championships, national and international tournaments. This association intends to change the account on the handicap with demonstration games, workshops of awareness in company, training with the licensees. The grant from the Dominique & Tom Alberici Foundation concerns the wheelchair-equipped sports equipment of the first handibasket school in France, created in 2017 by this club.

The project supported by the foundation is to create a new collection of podcasts for caregivers, by finding solutions to their daily worries.

ADAPEI 69 – COURT CIRCUIT – FEBRUARY 2016

Perce-Neige, the Medical and Education Institute in Thizy, coordinates a project of body-expression for the young people cared for by the centre. To do so, it has recruited an external dance company to add a professional and more demanding dimension to the workshops. This will enable the teenagers to develop skills that will be useful in their adult life: perseverance, the will to give the best of themselves, listening skills and pleasure of creating.

SOHDEV – RECOMMENDATION HANDBOOK: ORAL HYGIENE AND DISABILITIES – OCTOBER 2015

SOHDEV is promoting the growth of applied research in clinical epidemiology in the field of oral hygiene for disabled, dependent or vulnerable persons. SOHDEV has devised a comprehensive handbook on oral hygiene entitled "Oral Hygiene and Disabilities: a Recommendation Handbook" (Hygiène bucco-dentaire et handicap: guide de recommandations). This handbook will help to improve oral hygiene practices, reduce the risk of infection and the health problems associated with disabilities, and help maintain healthy teeth.

The aim of the project supported by our foundation in 2011 was to improve in the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS – partly ex-USSR) the support afforded to children and adolescents with social or mental disabilities, by broadcasting Clinical Educational Psychology and the MAKATON language programme. A new project in 2015, conducted in Russia, Georgia and Kazakhstan, aims to find an alternative to institutionalisation, and promote prevention among the very young, create family-type living areas and integrate children into the community. www.bice.org

Association ME WE, in partnership with the Jean Jacques Rousseau Medical and Education Institute (IME) in Vénissieux, is giving 25 young people the opportunity to direct a film in which they themselves are the actors, the idea being to reflect on how disabled people are seen by so-called able-bodied people. These films will then be presented in different institutional locations in Vénissieux and Lyon.

PAR HAZ'ART– ADAPTED CIRCUS WORKSHOPS – APRIL 2015

Since 2009 Par Haz'Art Association has been promoting the circus arts among disabled people, to enhance their skills and reintegration into everyday life, and allow them to be more independent and more conscious of their bodies. <http://www.parhazart.org/>

MAGIE A L'HOPITAL – TRAINING MAGICIANS AND PUBLISHING BOOK – JULY 2013 AND APRIL 2015

Since 2003 Magie à l'Hôpital has been organising magic shows for children in hospital and creating and publishing books containing artists' poems and drawings to be given to children.

Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici supported the association by financing on the one hand the training of volunteer magicians by a famous magician (Sylvain Mirouf in 2013), and on the other hand by creating and publishing a book for children, to be marketed as a way of perpetuating the association's actions. TALENT FACTORY – ALL IN THE COURSE OF A FAIRY TALE – JANUARY 2015

Talent Factory has given the children of the Institute of Paediatric Haematology and Oncology (IHOP) in Lyon the opportunity to help create a book of fairy tales. Seven stories by the brothers Grimm and Hans Christian Andersen will be included in this volume: six illustrated by artists and the seventh illustrated by the children themselves. An exhibition will present the book and use various means to illustrate the fairy tales: sculptures, videos, costumes, posters etc. One thousand copies of the book will be published and are devoted to the children being treated at the IHOP Institute. An audio CD will complete the book.

VIE ET ESPOIR – HOLIDAY IN A MID-MOUNTAIN RANGE FOR CHILDREN TREATED IN TEACHING HOSPITALS IN ROUEN AND LE HAVRE – JANUARY 2015

Since 1986, Vie et Espoir (Life and Hope) has been working with children suffering from leukaemia or cancerous tumours. This association provides holidays in particular, to help children recharge their batteries and enjoy some respite before resuming their treatment, or to build themselves back up after an illness. <http://www.vieetespoir.org>

TROISIÈME AVENUE – WE NEED YOU – OCTOBER 2014

Troisième Avenue is an association in the Lyon area, the objective of which is to create facilities promoting exchanges with disabled persons, for the purpose of helping other people, according to their possibilities and know-how. The association has located its activity in Meyzieu and hopes, with the support of Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici, to extend to the Montchat area (Lyon, 3rd arrondissement) by the end of 2014.

RIFHOP-PALIPED – FAMILY RESPITE HOLIDAYS FOR CHILDREN IN PALLIATIVE CARE – OCTOBER 2014

RIFHOP – PALIPED, a Paris area network for paediatric haematology, oncology and palliative care, organises respite holidays for the families of children in palliative care. These holidays, which are entirely free for families, enable them to share happy times together, new activities and create memories. The seven young people from 17 to 19 years of age who took part in the outing must first be familiar with diving, which is why Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici financed swimming lessons in pools with diving equipment and the with assistance of a specialised instructor.

CLAIRS HORIZONS – GLAMOUR DAY – JULY 2014

A free day of comfort for women after their cancer treatment, such is the goal of La Journée Glamour (Glamour Day) organised by Clairs Horizons: beauty treatment, nutritional advice, fitness, attention and a listening ear. The dual goal is to boost their self-esteem after cancer and lay firm foundations to make it easier for them to change their eating habits, adopt a healthy lifestyle and manage their stress.

LOCOMOTIVE –SUPPORT FOR CHILDREN IN END-OF-LIFE SITUATIONS: AT HOME OR IN HOSPITAL – NOVEMBER 2010 – JULY 2014

Since 1988 at the teaching hospital (CHU) in Grenoble, LOCOMOTIVE has been helping children suffering from cancer or leukaemia and their families. The association produces films aimed at families and caregivers. Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici helped to finance the film entitled "Support for children in end-of-life situations: at home or in hospital" (Accompagner un enfant en fin de vie: à domicile ou à l'hôpital) in November 2010, and the film Footprints (Empreintes) in July 2014, a film that seeks to understand how adults live their lives after having had cancer as children.

ASMAE is an association founded in 1987 that works with underprivileged children and was supported by Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici in July 2010. According to the WHO in 2008, 10% of the population of Madagascar is disabled and only 2% of disabled children have access to suitable education. LES DOIGTS QUI RÊVENT – CREATION OF A MULTI-SENSORY 'TOOLKIT' BASED ON THE WORLD OF CARTOON BOOKS FOR YOUNG BLIND PEOPLE – OCTOBER 2013

Founded in 1994, Les Doigts Qui Rêvent (Dreaming fingers) is an association that publishes books aimed at children with visual impairments. Since it was created, it has published close to 200 titles.

Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici supported a project entitled "Mille Milliard de Mille Sens", a multi-sensory 'toolkit' that contains miniature reproductions of the characters in cartoon books, all of which will be designed by the end users; the visually impaired children who will get to use them. It will be produced by an integration workshop, the aim being to support people who are outside the labour market.

COVER DRESSING – ORGANISATION OF AN ALTERNATIVE FASHION WEEK: AN 'ADAPTED FASHION' SHOW FOR DISABLED PERSONS – JULY 2013

A new association based in Fécamp was created in January 2011: COVER DRESSING, reflects the desire expressed by Mapie Plantaz, its female president, to create fashionable and stylish clothing that is also ergonomic, for people who have trouble dressing and undressing themselves.

The foundation supported the association by financing the creation of their website.

SPACEJUNK – RAISING THE AWARENESS OF WOMEN LIVING IN DEPRIVED URBAN AREAS REGARDING BREAST CANCER SCREENING – JULY 2013 AND JULY 2014

Since 2010, Spacejunk Art Centers have been conducting the Venus project, an artistic project devoted to raising the awareness of women living in deprived urban areas regarding breast cancer screening. For Venus IV in 2013, some one hundred artists worked on embellishing the black and white photographs of 150 semi-naked voluntary models. The canvases were first exhibited in Lyon then sold at auction. Profits were donated to Europa Donna, an association that promotes breast cancer screening. ELAN POUR LA VIE – DANCING DESPITE DISABILITIES – FEBRUARY 2013

Élan pour la Vie is an association created in 1999 by Nadine Birtschansky. As a dancer of international reputation who suffers from multiple sclerosis, she aims to change the way people view disabilities by providing original contemporary creations for professional artists or amateurs, both able-bodied and disabled. Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici supported the development and distribution of their latest creation.

AMD FRANCE – INTEGRATED PROGRAMME AIMED AT FIGHTING CHILD DISABILITIES IN CHAKARIA, SOUTH-EAST BANGLADESH – JANUARY 2013

For 30 years now in the coastal region of Cox's Bazar (Bangladesh), various forms of rickets not caused by vitamin deficiency have been observed. They are due to complex nutritional problems, which result in malformations that can rob people of their ability to walk. This is a new highly prevalent disease, the causes of which are still partly unknown.

Since 2001 the association Aide Médicale et Développement (AMD) has been conducting actions aimed at fighting child disabilities through multi-disciplinary solutions. A disability centre has been created by AMD in Chakaria and Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici has granted a three-year support to AMD for this project.

This project holder was an able-bodied dancer who ended up in a wheelchair as a result of a serious neurological disease. Handi Line is an association that aims to promote dance for people in wheelchairs, and the organisation and coordination of teaching and international dance championships. The foundation supported Handi Line by financing the creation of a training workshop for coordinators and enabling people in wheelchairs to participate in a championship challenge.

ITD MONDE – THE "FIAVOARANA SAHAMBAY" PROGRAMME IN MADAGASCAR – JULY 2012

This project is supported by ITD Monde (formerly Villes en Transition). It consists of producing medical alcohol from locally-produced illegal moonshine, as well as essential oils. The foundation supports this project for the overall aspect of its approach, which is to reduce the alcohol consumption, give people jobs, involve disabled workers, settle the populations and raise people's awareness regarding cancer among women.

INSTITUT CURIE – PILOT PROGRAMME TO HELP PEOPLE GET BACK TO WORK AFTER CANCER – JULY 2012

This programme supported by Institut Curie (www.curie.fr) in Paris, is implemented by the Maison des Patients within Institut Curie in Saint Cloud. Professionals and volunteers coordinate workshops to help ex-cancer patients overcome their difficulties, by coordinating a support system for salaried patients, to make it easier for them to get back to work. We supported this project by bearing the expenses of professionals not employed by Institut Curie, and the management costs of the 'back to work' support programme.

LA MAISON DE LIONEL – OCTOBER 2011

La Maison de Lionel, which is part of the French Red Cross located in le Teil in Ardèche, is a family-sized group of people. It welcomes people who are at least 20 years old and in the advanced stages of serious illnesses. The objective is to alleviate their physical and mental suffering, and give them the best possible quality of life until the end of their lives. Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici financed part of the building's facilities.

ART DANS LA CITE – FENETRE SUR SHOW – JUNE 2011 AND OCTOBER 2012

Founded in 1999, Art dans la Cité aims to introduce contemporary visual works of art into hospitals with the help of artists, to improve the quality of life of patients, improve their arrival and stay, as well as the working conditions of staff, thanks to the collective creation of works of art permanently installed in the hospital's reception area and living spaces.

The first project supported by Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici concerned the Healthcare teams working in the haematology ward at Armand Trousseau hospital in Paris.

The partnership was renewed in 2012 for duplicating this project in the Institute of Paediatric Haematology and Oncology (IHOP), at the Centre Léon Bérard in Lyon. <http://artdanslacite.eu>

UNE SOURIS VERTE – CHILDREN WHO ARE DIFFERENT (WEBSITE, DOCUMENTARY NETWORK ETC.) – JANUARY 2011

As an association, “Une Souris Verte” has been fighting the exclusion of young disabled persons in everyday life for over 20 years.

HANDIDENT PACA – A MOBILE DENTAL SURGERY FOR DISABLED PERSONS – NOVEMBER 2010

The main mission of Handident PACA, created in 2005, is to promote access to dental care among disabled persons. Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici helped to finance a mobile dental surgery that can be driven to the numerous institutions throughout the region, to provide care for severely disabled persons who are unable to travel. <http://handidentpaca.fr/>

DESMAE – A VIBRATING DANCE FLOOR FOR PEOPLE WITH HEARING IMPAIRMENTS – NOVEMBER 2010

The Lyon-based Association Kaëlli - Les Ateliers Desmaé was created in 2001 by Kilina Crémona. This dancer of international repute suddenly went deaf in 2000. She decided to create a school devoted to training and creation in the art of contemporary dance for deaf people, people with hearing impairments and hearing people. This location is the only dance school intent on building a bridge between dancing and deafness in France. Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici helped to finance a show entitled "The Metamorphosis of cherries" (La Métamorphose des cerises).

ASMAE – SUPPORTING A SCHOOL FOR YOUNG BLIND PEOPLE IN BURKINA FASO – JULY 2010

ASMAE-Association Sœur-Emmanuelle developed a partnership with the ABPAM, an association based in Burkina Faso aimed at promoting people who are blind or visually impaired.

ABPAM is working towards the socio-economic integration of visually impaired persons and the promotion of their cultural, sporting and artistic fulfilment. The association created a special school, the first of its kind in Burkina Faso. Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici helped to finance the training of teachers in this school, and to improve the conditions in which children are accommodated.

FONDATION GAILLANNE – GUIDE DOGS FOR BLIND CHILDREN – JULY 2010 AND MAY 2012

Founded in L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue by Frédéric Gaillanne, Mira Europe trains and provides guide dogs for blind children throughout Europe free of charge. After financing the purchasing and training of some of the guide dogs in 2010, Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici renewed its support in 2012 by financing audible signalling devices for the young people's reception building and residence.

CENTRE LEON BERARD – NEW RULES FOR ADMINISTERING BLOOD TRANSFUSIONS FOR CANCER PATIENTS IN THEIR OWN HOMES – MARCH 2009

The Centre Léon Bérard in Lyon set up this project with the help of the GATE-CNRS health economics branch, the idea being to develop an interactive information tool to help with decision making, and to record the preferences of patients in terms of treatment and transfusions. The foundation supported this project by financing the study.

ODYNEO – MEETING DOLPHINS IN THE WILD – JANUARY 2009

ESAT L'étang Carret, an employment rehabilitation centre for disabled person in Dommartin, is dependent on the ARIMC, a regional association located in the Rhône-Alpes region devoted to people suffering from cerebral palsy.

Fondation Dominique & Tom Alberici financed part of the one-week trip to discover and observe dolphins in their natural habitat in the Red Sea. This dolphin-discovery outing was essentially achieved by swimming with flippers, masks and tubas, and proved a great opportunity for participants to push back their own limits.
